Registration

WEFTEC Registration is FREE for WEF Student Members!

- If you are a WEF student member, register for WEFTEC online.
- If you are not a WEF member, <u>become a member</u> before registering for the conference.

As you register for WEFTEC, be sure to indicate if you will be attending the WEF Community Service Project on Saturday, October 16. Transportation will be provided from the Hilton Chicago Headquarters Hotel (720 S. Michigan Ave) for a beach cleanup. Buses will begin loading at 8:15am and will be departing as full. Buses will arrive back at the Hilton by 4:00pm.

Airfare

Virtual Water Palooza

Manierre Elementary School loved Water Palooza so much in 2017, that they partnered with us to help pivot this year's event to a fun virtual experience. The 2021 Virtual Water Palooza event will be occurring on Friday, October 15th at Manierre Elementary, with 350 kiddos in attendance. We will be providing content from multiple organizations, including MWRD's "Where Does it Go" virtual journey



through the depths of Chicago's infrastructure, the US Coast Guard, and Shedd Aquarium, among others. Saturday, October 16

WEF Community Service Project, 8:00am – 4:00pm. Location: 12th Street Beach Natural Area 1521 S. Linn White Drive (12th Street at Lake Michigan on Northerly Island).

The 2021 WEF Community Service Project, "Life is Better by the Lake, 12th Street Beach Restoration" will be held on Saturday, October 16th in collaboration with the Chicago Parks and the Shedd Aquarium, located at 1521 S. Linn White Drive (12th Street at Lake Michigan on Northerly Island). This year, our group of volunteers will be cleaning up the beach and removing invasive species from the area. The 12th Street Beach Natural Area is part of the Chicago Park District. It is home to the dune grasses and native flowering plants that play an important role for the habitat of the shore birds. In 2019, the Shedd Aquarium volunteers collected 460lbs of trash from this beach. For more information on the 12th Street Beach Natural Area please check out their website.

Registration for the service project is free and open to all WEFTEC participants. Volunteers will receive transportation to and from the worksite, a t-shirt, lunch, and a WEF Community Service Project ribbon for their WEFTEC badge. Service Project volunteers will also leave a lasting mark on the water environment in Chicago.

The project will serve as an educational platform for the community to learn about water, the environment, and green infrastructure. To volunteer at the event, add the "WEF Community Service Project" to your WEFTEC Registration.

*Buses will pick up volunteers at the Hilton Chicago Headquarters Hotel (8th Street South entrance). We will begin loading at 8:15am and will be departing as filled. Buses will arrive back at the Hilton by 4:00pm.
